What is the National Dental Practice-Based Research Network (NDPBRN)?

The national network is a consortium of practices and clinics devoted principally to the oral health care of patients, but whose members investigate research questions with practical impact that will improve the quality of dental care.

What are the goals of the nation's network?

The goals are to conduct national oral health studies on topics of importance to practitioners and their patients, to provide evidence to improve routine dental care, and to facilitate movement of the latest evidence into routine clinical practice. A key objective is to conduct studies that will improve the knowledge base for clinical decision-making.

How is the nation's network funded?

The National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research (NIDCR), part of the National Institutes of Health (NIH), funded for 2012-2019 the University of Alabama at Birmingham in collaboration with six other institutions in the United States (listed below). How do I join?

You can enroll online by going to the www.NationalDentalPBRN.org, and following directions from there to complete the enrollment questionnaire. You need to have a functioning email address to enroll.

How much time will I have to commit when I participate in a study?

The amount of time will vary depending on the specific project. Studies range from questionnaires to studies in the office. Our goal is to implement projects that will easily integrate into your everyday practice routine.

What are the benefits of joining the nation's network?

- Exchange ideas with fellow practitioners
- Participate in research projects that benefit your practice with participation at one of three levels
 depending on your interest: 1. informational -receive newsletters and correspondence only; 2. limited
 -also participate in questionnaires; or 3. full -also participate in in-office clinical studies.
- Distinguishes your practice from other practices, acting as a practice promoter or practice builder
- Increases your practice's visibility and stature among dental patients
- Enhances communication with patients by showing that you and your office care about the scientific basis of daily clinical practice (you "stay current")
- Serves as a team builder for practice staff, and engages the entire staff in the excitement of discovery and quality improvement
- Studies can improve the quality of dental care by contributing to the scientific basis for the dental procedures that are their focus
- Receive financial remuneration for the time spent doing research
- Potential to present at local, state, and national dental meetings and research conferences
- Receive Continuing Education credit for attendance at NDPBRN annual meetings and participating in training and certification activities for specific NDPBRN studies



Western Region (region #1)

Administratively based at the Center for Health Research, Portland, OR.

This region comprises Alaska, American Samoa, California, Colorado, Guam, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Northern Mariana Islands, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming.

Midwest Region (region #2)

Administratively based at the HealthPartners Research Foundation in Minneapolis, MN. This region comprises Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, Wisconsin.

Southwest Region (region #3)

Administratively based at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio in San Antonio, TX. This region comprises Arizona, Kansas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas.

South Central Region (region #4)

Administratively based at the University of Alabama at Birmingham in Birmingham, AL.

This region comprises Alabama, Arkansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Tennessee, West Virginia.

South Atlantic Region (region #5)

Administratively based at the University of Florida in Gainesville, FL.

This region comprises Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia.

Northeast Region (region #6)

Administratively based at the University of Rochester in Rochester, NY.

This region comprises Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, US Virgin Islands, Vermont.

The Coordinating Center for the national network is administratively based at Westat in Rockville, MD.

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
