Study 6 "Questionable Occlusal Carious Lesions"

This study follows diagnosis and subsequent treatment of 35 questionable occlusal carious lesions for a period of two years. The term "questionable" is defined as a tooth with no cavitation (no continuity break in the enamel) and no radiographic radiolucencies, but the р cs 0 r

presence of caries is suspected due to roughness, surface opacities, or staining. Characterist of the lesions, patients' baseline caries risk, and 24-month outcomes of treatments (both restorative and preventive) will be examined.

Study 15 "Blood Sugar Testing in Dental Practice" This study will examine the feasibility of routine glucose testing in dental practice. Patients identified as meeting high risk criteria will be eligible for a finger stick screening test. Patient with abnormal readings would receive printed materials from the American Diabetes Association, and possible referral to a physician. Both patients and providers will provide feedback on the process. Approximately 20-30 patients will be screened per practitioner.
